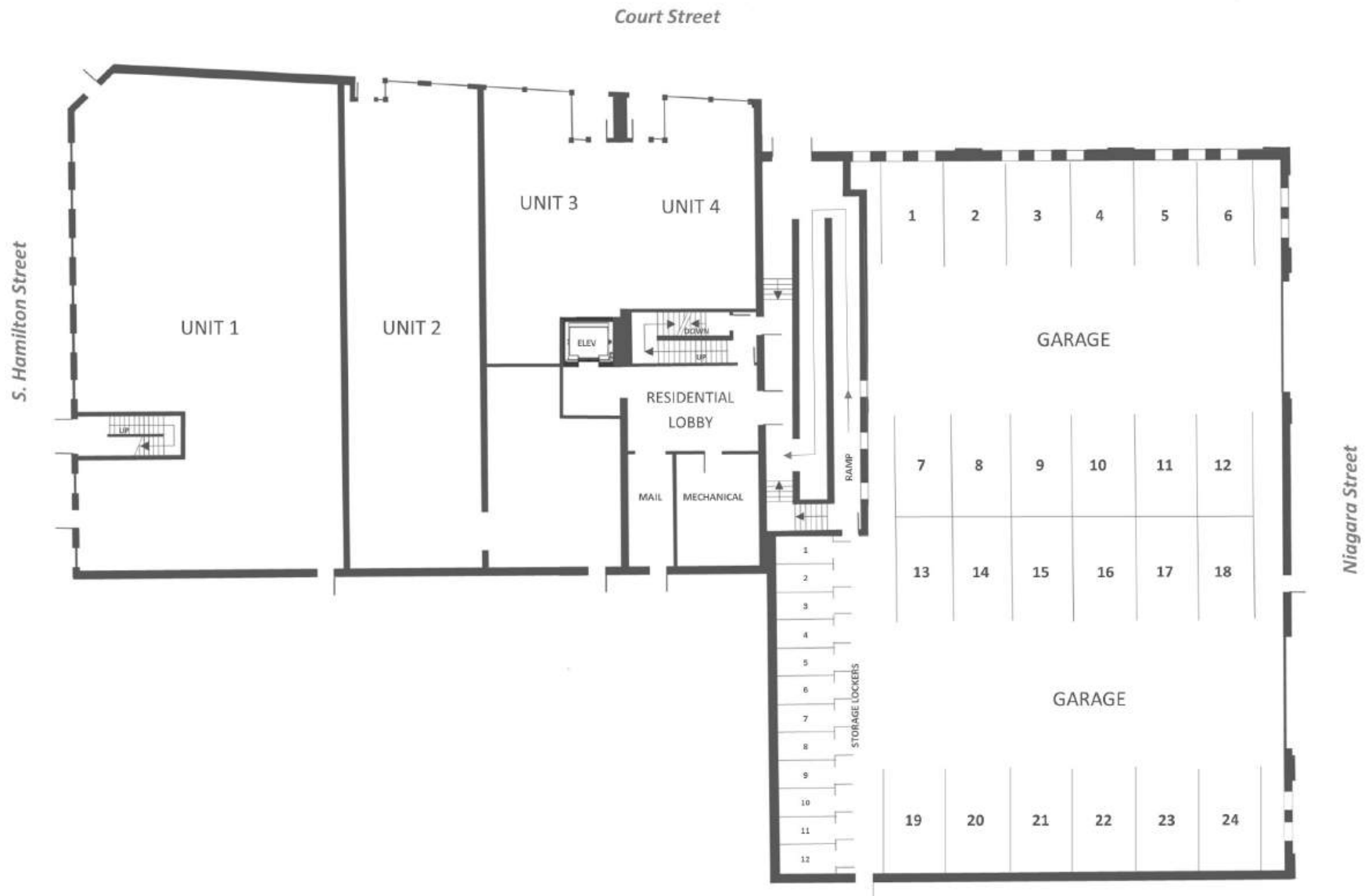

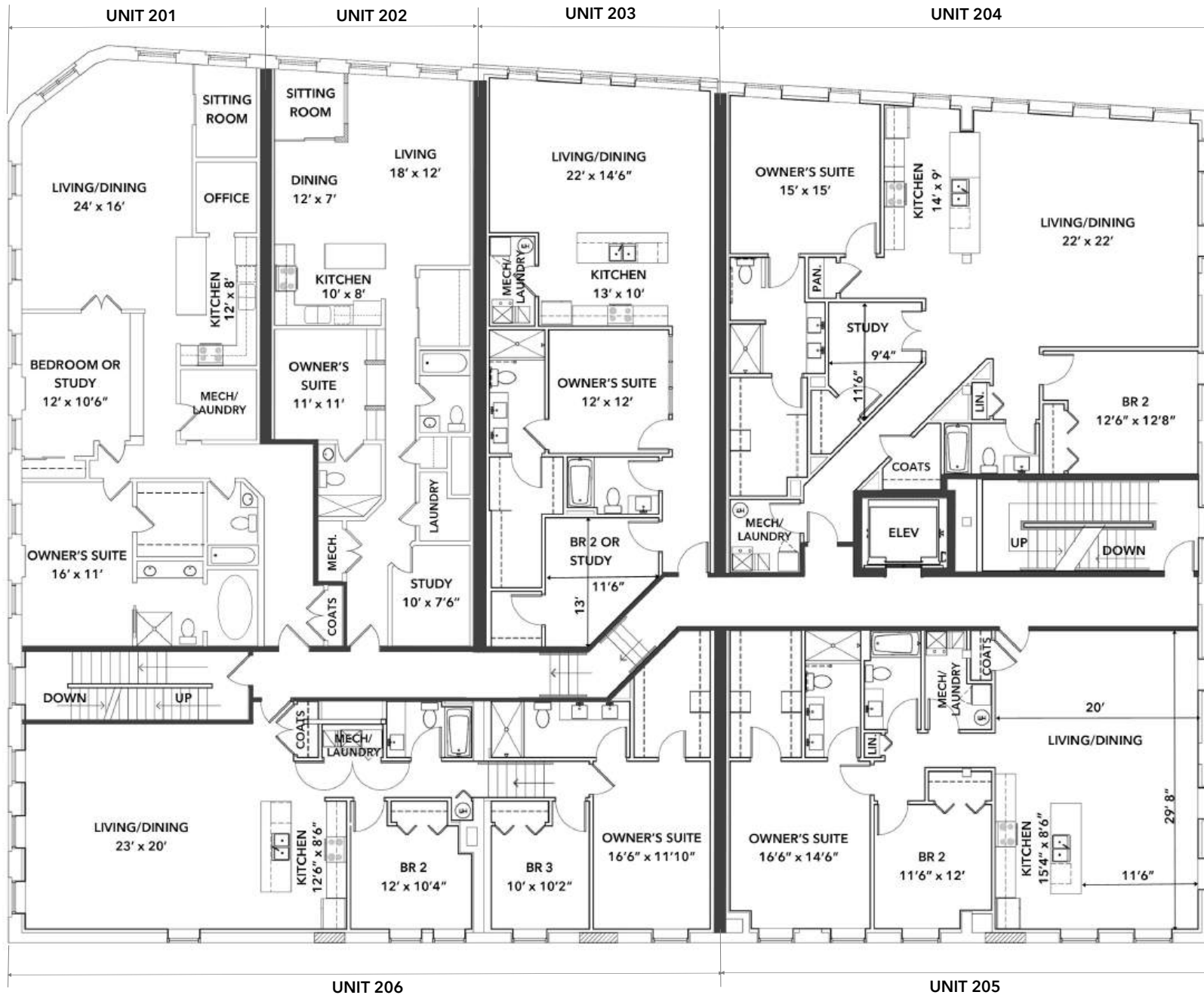

FLOOR 2



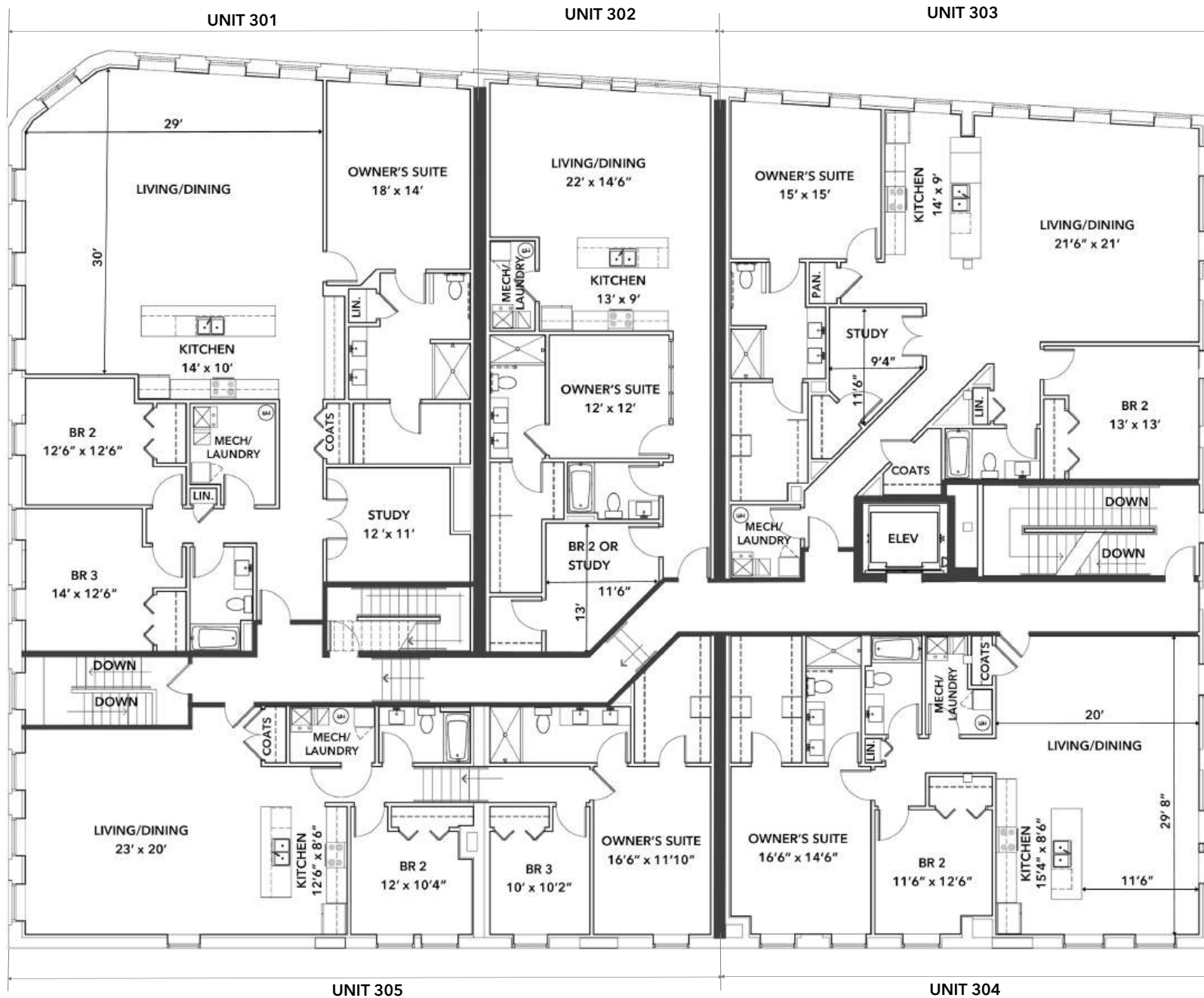

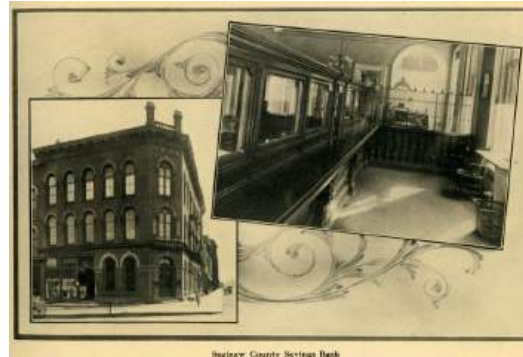

In 1822 — where Court and Hamilton Streets now intersect — the U.S. Military established a fort but abandoned it within a year.

Fur traders and farmers quickly took over the buildings and a small settlement took root: Saginaw.

Soon, the lumber industry was born, the city's population exploded, and with it, the demand for goods and services.

All around the site of the original fort — in the area now known as Old Town Saginaw — buildings sprouted to accommodate the needs of the young city's growing populace.

Among the first, completed in 1869, was an elegant building at the corner of Court and S. Hamilton Streets. At the same time, two buildings behind it were constructed facing Court Street.

For many years, these three buildings were home to a variety of thriving businesses. Today, they form West Bank Lofts.

In 2006, Jakes Old City Grill opened on the first floor of the building on the corner of Court and Hamilton Streets, but the first floor of the other two buildings and the second and third floors of all three sat empty.

That's changing as extensive renovations have breathed new life into Old Town's most iconic buildings, joining others that have made Old Town the vibrant area that it is.

Today, Old Town teems with an array of casual and connoisseur eateries that serve a range of delicious fare . . . with taverns that create craft cocktails and pour local brew . . . with mouth-watering pastries baked daily.

Charming shops line sidewalks that beckon leisurely walks or morning runs. And the Saginaw River is yours for the gazing.
